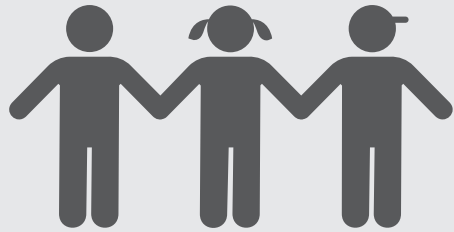

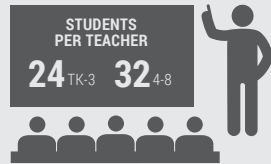

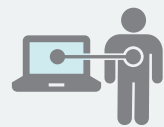
### Distance Learning Model

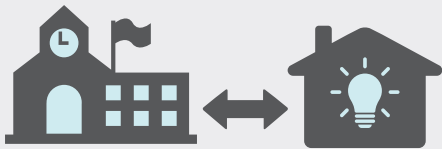




## HYBRID & IN-PERSON LEARNING

### Transition to In-Person Learning

The transition from Distance Learning to In-Person Learning may involve a Hybrid phase.



#### HYBRID MODEL

Assigned cohorts will attend in-person on specific days, limiting the number of students on campus at any given time.

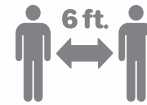
When allowable under state and local health orders, the District is prepared to offer in-person instruction. To ensure that in-person learning is as safe as possible, **extensive safety measures have been implemented.**

### SAFETY MEASURES



#### Limited Campus Access

Campus access will be limited to essential visitors and entrances & exits at school sites will be monitored.



#### Social Distancing

Social distancing will be practiced and large gatherings avoided while on campus.



#### Frequent Cleaning

Surfaces and facilities in the school will be cleaned and disinfected frequently.



#### Screening Protocols

COVID-19 Screening protocols are in place for handling of possible cases.



#### On-call Nurse

A contracted nurse is on-call in the event that additional nursing support staff is needed.



#### Face Masks

Face coverings will be used as recommended by health officials.

### MENTAL HEALTH & SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL WELLBEING



#### Remote Counseling

Students needing intensive support are provided remote counseling services by clinicians from the Monterey County Behavioral Health department.

#### Mental Health Services

A Licensed Clinical Social Worker is available to provide essential mental health services via phone or online conferencing platforms.



### SUPPORT FOR UNDUPLICATED STUDENTS



**Site Liaisons** assist with identification of Foster & Homeless students & help ensure that they have access to basic school needs.



**Students with exceptional needs** will be supported by a team of educators in their progress towards IEP goals.



**English Learners** will receive both integrated and designated English Language Development instruction daily.
